Dear Mr. Witt:

The Colorado Department of Education (CDE) received Education ReEnvisioned BOCES' application to form a new administrative unit on September 3, 2018. In accordance with ECEA 3.01(4) the department is reviewing the application. If any additional information is required, CDE will notify the BOCES no later than September 19, 2018. Any additional information requested must be submitted no later than close of business on October 1, 2018.

In addition to the review of the application, either the Department or any entity affected by an application for a new or reorganized administrative unit may request the entity seeking the change to secure and pay for a report prepared by a CDE approved independent third party. The report must describe the anticipated revenues and expenditures for all affected administrative units. The independent third party must possess sufficient expertise in accounting, special education budget development and projection, and special education fiscal requirements. The request for the third party report must be made within 30 calendar days of the day the Department notifies the applicant and affected entities that the application is complete [ECEA 3.01(3)(e)]. The Department recommends that Education ReEnvisioned be prepared to move forward with conducting the independent third party report in the event that it is requested.

If requested, the third party report should be submitted to CDE as soon as possible since a final determination cannot be made until all requested information has been provided. Background Information, Description of Need:

The Colorado Department of Education has issued our District Performance Framework (DPF) and School Performance Frameworks (SPF). These are just preliminary ratings at this time and the final frameworks will be issued after the Request to Reconsider has been submitted and the process finalized.

The Request to Reconsider draft was due on September 14. The Colorado Department of Education (CDE) will review the draft and provide feedback for the final draft due on October 15. This year there were two paths that we could take in our request since we were approved for three different codes for Colorado Preparatory Academy (CPA), and Pikes Peak Online School (PPOS) has been Alternative Education Campus (AEC) approved.

Background Information, Description of Need: As we prepare for the amended budget process, the first and biggest issue to know and understand is the student count that will be funded, and how that compares to the original adopted budget.

Relevant Data and Expected Outcomes: Student count at the two schools, CPA and PPOS, are both up over last year and higher than the original budget as well. The increased student count will result in more funds being available to serve the students through our contracted service provider, K12, as well as the EDreINV – directed services handled through the Oversight and Shared Support Costs (OSSC) structure, and then, as well, provide a limited increase to the Administrative Revenue that is charged at 3% of revenue.

Recommended Course of Action/Motion Requested: We will continue to monitor this up to and through the official 'October Count' process in preparation for determining the amended budget for the year.

- <u>AU-</u> The Administrative Unit application was a lot of work to complete in a short amount of time. The application had a lot of good information included; although, I am disappointed that the completion timeframe did not allow for the time to research all the information that could be included and add it to the application.
- Leadership Meeting- The first admin meeting with our school leaders was Wednesday, September 12. The topics of the meeting came from our site visit last May, as both schools, CPA and PPOS, had these improvement threads, Effective Professional Development and Student Responsible Environment.
- 3. <u>Induction Review-</u> CDE has requested that all induction programs submit their operational information for review no matter what year of operation they are in. I will be submitting our program for review by the due date.



- 4. <u>Online Assurances-</u> The beginning of each school year has a lot of due dates for our schools. One of the due dates is the online assurances. This is an important document that is submitted to CDE that identifies all the ways we count student attendance. This document has been completed by our school staff and submitted to CDE.
- School Action Plans- Our school leaders have completed their school action plans for this school year. Our school data will be monitored through the monthly checklist, just like last year, and our action plans will be reviewed quarterly. School action plans will be presented to our Board of Directors at the October Board meeting.
- 6. <u>School Accreditation Site Visits-</u> I am starting to complete preliminary planning and scheduling for our school site visits this year. Schools that are in Priority Improvement and Turnaround will need a site visit in January and May. Schools that are in Improvement or higher will need a site visit in May. Final decisions about our site visit schedule will be completed after our district and school request to reconsider feedback has been sent back to us.
- 7. <u>EDAC Meeting-</u> The first EDAC meeting will be Thursday, September 27. The agenda for our first meeting will be:
 - Mission of the EDAC and vision for the SAC
 - Communication Strategies to Build Stronger Schools and Community Relationships

- <u>K12 Admin Meeting-</u> I attended my first Admin team meeting in Westminster on September 12, 2018. Effective staff development as well as being student responsible environment were the top two priorities of the meeting. I was also able to meet and establish a relationship with the administrative team for both CPA and PPOS.

In this month's Business Director report, you will see the financials as submitted to the auditor. So, while still technically, unaudited, they are final from our perspective and we would not anticipate any material changes from the audit process.

These result reflect an improved fund balance in the general funds of 3.6%, up from last year's ending 3.1% figure. This does include fully writing off the unpaid balance from STEMsCO. As a result, any repayment we might receive from them in the future would effectively be new revenue in that fiscal year.

All of the peripheral activities are basically wrapped up as of this report – those regarding not only STEMsCO, but our former participation and support of the CEL grant with the former partners of CDLS and iLC as well. Therefore, we head into the new year with good clarity and focus and much more security from a financial perspective than a year ago.

After the audit process concludes, we will be able to distribute that final report with any reconciliation of what changes between now and then.
